Stewardship for All Seasons (SAS)

This month I'll begin the conversation about the SAS program.

At our OSL annual meeting we voted to participate in the SEMN Synod supported Stewardship program SAS. A number of ELCA synods are now promoting and supporting SAS (North Carolina Synod, Rocky Mountain Synod, East Central Wisconsin Synod, South Dakota Synod, etc.).

We will begin the 6-week SAS Fall Appeal in October and conclude in November. SAS is led by ELCA Pastor Mike Ward (North Carolina Synod – ELCA). Through SAS we will look to advance our discipleship in following Jesus and increase our current regular giving (from 2018 to 2019) to further our Gospel Ministry here at OSL and our outreach to the greater community with the Good News.

Members of the Stewardship Team attended the 1st training session at Gloria Dei Lutheran (ELCA) in Rochester this Spring and will attend the 2nd session on August 22nd. The Team is currently meeting twice per month in preparation

for our Fall Appeal. In the weeks and months ahead we will be in contact with members of OSL through various means to provide more extensive information about SAS and the 6 week Fall Appeal.

This is an exciting opportunity here at OSL to increase the participation of members in the life of our faith family, build on our Living Everyday As Disciples/LEAD (SEMN Synod) with Christ, and strengthen more people in their stewardship practices of time, talents and treasures.

I look forward to seeing how we as a congregation can grow from “funding our yearly ministry expenses” to a stewardship culture wherein we increase our ministry outreach, give of ourselves out of gratitude to the Lord for all that we have and further our call as faithful people of God. Please lift up the Stewardship Team in your prayers for their work on our behalf.

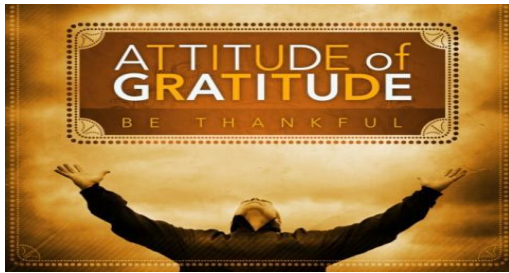

Reflections

with Pastor Betsy Dartt

When it comes to Stewardship we are a people called to an “attitude of gratitude.” All that we have has its source in God. For this we give God thanks and praise. Remember that during the Summer months with lower attendance we also have lower offerings/giving. This impacts our Gospel ministry. As a faith family we need everyone’s support, spiritually and financially, year-round. Please continue to give generously whether you are here or away during the Summer months. You can always mail your offering to the church. Please Note: At this time we need to pay back a combined amount of about \$22,000 in our Lines of Credit to the C Kumm Fund and to the Bank. Please consider what you can give above and beyond your regular offering (weekly/monthly) to pay this back sooner rather than later. Thank you in advance! – Pastor Mark

A child came home from Bible School humming a familiar tune. Mom asked about the song. Cheerfully, the little one began to tell of the story about a big bear in the lesson for the day. Apparently, this was a very happy bear because he was called “Gladly”. “Well,” exclaimed the youngster, “This bear must have had some problems with his eyes. They even taught us a song about it!” Mother was intrigued. A song and a story about a bear who couldn’t see well. Mother wracked her brain in vain to remember a Bible story about a bear. “What is the song, Honey?” Mom asked. With gusto, the child sang out “Gladly, the Cross-Eyed (I’d) Bear.”

The child took in only what her limited experience could imagine. She didn’t yet understand what it means for a Christian to carry the cross as a follower of Jesus. I think a lot of adults don’t fully understand what it means to take up one’s cross and follow Christ. To be a Christian we must be ready to trade our dependence on the things of this world for the gift of faith in God who redeems, changes, and offers us a new vision of life. We die to sin and lift high a cross that proclaims victory over death. The only way to live is through faith in Jesus Christ. There is nothing we can do to merit the grace of God.

At Our Saviors, we are claiming a vision for ministry reaching far into the 21st century. We are a people who take up the cross of Jesus Christ to proclaim God’s power and grace in the lives of all people. There are so many who need to hear the Lord’s proclamation for right living. There are so many who need to know that we are accountable for our choices and our actions. There are so many who need to feel forgiveness for causing harm or hurt. There are so many who need to feel the healing strength of Jesus who died and rose for each of us.

Look around at what’s happening to the people in our community. See what is happening with our youth that changes everything. Expect new ideas with the upcoming Stewardship for all Seasons. It is risky to change from the old to the new, but Jesus continues to call us beyond what is easy and comfortable to challenge us with the vision that will bring the good news of Christ to the world. Let us gladly focus our eyes on the cross (Does that make us cross-eyed?) and lift the kingdom of God to all who are willing to see.
