# Joy in the Journey

"We claim you as our own."

One of the best parts of Lent is the meals shared together in the church basement. I recall last March one of our older members said, "I can't hear much of the conversation, but I love looking at all the faces and feeling the love; it is the best part of my week". A student picking up people's plates to bring them to the dishwasher told me, "I love feeling useful. I feel valued". A parent of a young child commented to me, "I can relax; I know my child is safe, and I can eat a meal while it is still warm".

It is a tangible reminder that everyone is important to God, everyone has gifts to share, if we have eyes to search and hearts to understand. Our Christian faith teaches that love is greater than ancestry or blood.

Jesus invites people into a larger family which is defined by commitment to the Kingdom of God rather than biology. Those who were joined to him, as ultimately signified by baptism, entered not only into a personal relationship with their Savior, but into a family relationship with all the others gathered into His Church. "For Jesus, water is thicker than blood" (John Bell, *A beginner's guide to a larger Christ*, Wild Goose Publications). On the cross, the dying Savior looks at those standing around and turns the attention of his faithful, grief-stricken Mother to a young man, his disciple John, standing nearby, saying, "Mother, here is your son" and

to John he says, "Here is your mother". Ever since, those who belong to Jesus have had to see themselves as also belonging to each other. We are not meant to do life alone. We need others to help us become the people God desires us to be. Children's most important and influential relationship is with their parents, but the Christian community is important for the full development of children and parents alike. No biological family is sufficient. Children need others to encourage them in their life of faith and extend their horizons. I had a time in my teenage years when I could hear nothing my own mother said, but I would engage in conversation with my grandmother's friends at church and the mother of the children I babysat for. They were/are part of my "big family of God".

I invite you to take some time with the story of the little girl raised to life and the woman brought back to a full life in Mark 5:21-43. It is a beautiful story of lives made whole by Jesus. Jesus doesn't want anyone to live in the shadows. The woman who had bled for 12 years has been hidden in the shadows. Her story is paralleled with Jairus' daughter because to be hid away, to not be recognized for the gifts you offer, is a living death. When Jesus calls her "Daughter", he names that wholeness is social and spiritual, not only physical. She will be restored to her community, rejected no longer. Jesus makes her visible again. When Jesus tells her 'your faith has made you well", He is recognizing her courage to raise her voice, he sees her inner strength. She is seeking life and

Jesus helps her step over the threshold from almost death to **true life**.

It is no accident that Jesus cannot heal the wealthy girl of privilege before the bankrupt woman at wit's end is healed. Our lives are bound together, whatever affects one directly affects all indirectly. Jesus wants us to experience a life connected with others. Lean into the love of Jesus, let that love fill you with courage and openness to notice those around you. Who can you cheer on and lift up? Who has God put in your path that seems to have lost their spark? Can you remind them of the warmth of home? A place set for them at the table...that someone does care. That's what family does. Jesus claims you as His own and those who belong to Jesus also belong to each other.


